# Program History

Since its inception in 1981, the Ithaca College women's soccer program has established a winning tradition, featuring a pair of national titles (1990 and 1991), 19 NCAA playoff invitations – no school has made more – and a streak of four straight NCAA semifinals visits, a run matched by just one other program (UC-San Diego). In 28 years of competition, the Bombers are 370-113-65 (.733).

**Linda Buettner**, Ithaca's first head coach, posted a 53-24-5 mark in five years. **Maureen Nolan**, who became the school's all-time leading scorer; **Leslie Murphy**, who set the Bombers' career assist record; and goalkeeper **Laura Slagle**, the program's career save leader; were among the team's top players in the early years. In 1983 the Bombers won the New York State Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (NYSIAAW) championship. One season later, Ithaca downed Geneseo, 2-1, to claim the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) title. In **Buettner's** last season, Ithaca defended its ECAC title by edging Hartwick, 2-1, on an overtime goal by all-American **Tracey Marullo**. **Marullo** was voted into the Ithaca College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001; **Buettner** joined her last fall.

**Christine Pritchard** guided the program in 1986 and led Ithaca to a state championship, thanks in part to the play of first-team all-American **Terri Cilento**.

The program's climb into the national spotlight began in 1987, with the arrival of coach **Pat Farmer**, a 1998 inductee into Ithaca's Athletic Hall of Fame.

A 2-0 playoff loss to Scranton that year marked Ithaca's first NCAA appearance. Ithaca won the NYSWCAA title in 1988 and returned to the NCAA playoffs. The Bombers advanced to the semifinals before losing, 2-0, in triple overtime to UC-San Diego.

The 1989 team placed first in the NYSWCAA tournament and again reached the NCAA semifinals. This time all-American **Tracy Deyle's** two goals led Ithaca to a 2-0 semifinal win over Methodist before UC-San Diego beat the Bombers in the championship game, 3-2, in a third overtime period.

A stingy defense was the key in the 1990 and 1991 postseasons; the Bombers did not yield a goal in eight playoff games. Goalkeeper **Beth Howland** was in net for seven of those shutouts and set an NCAA record for lowest career goals-against average in playoff games (0.15). The Bombers earned their first title in 1990 with a shoot-out win over Cortland and won the 1991 championship by downing Rochester, 2-0. In 1998, **Howland** joined **Deyle** in the Ithaca College Athletic Hall of Fame.

In 1992 the Bombers won the NYSWCAA championship and participated in the NCAA postseason. Back **Cathy Moss**, who was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2004, earned all-American honors in 1990 and 1992. The 1993 team won the NYSWCAA crown and advanced to the NCAA New York regional finals before falling in overtime, 1-0, to William Smith. Back **Megan Collins** and midfielder **Kristin Kaupang** earned all-American honors; both are recent inductees into Ithaca's Hall of Fame. The 1993

season was the last at Ithaca for **Farmer**, who was hired to direct Penn State's first-year program.

In 1994, under new coach **Mindy Quigg**, Ithaca won its sixth state championship in seven years and earned a spot in the NCAA playoffs. **Tanya Koning** capped her career with first-team all-American honors.

In 1995 the Bombers finished 11-4-4, but missed the NCAA playoffs for the first time in nine years. The following year all-Americans **Amanda Mabee** and **Melanie Jones** helped Ithaca to a 16-4 record and a trip to the NCAA quarterfinals. **Mabee** joined Ithaca's Hall of Fame.

In 1997 the Bombers made their 10th NCAA playoff trip. A year later Ithaca returned to the NCAA semifinals, hosting the event for the first time. Back **Erin DeMarco**, the second Bomber sophomore to earn all-America honors, led Ithaca to a 15-4-2 record. **DeMarco** earned all-America honors again in 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, **Becca Berry** helped the Bombers to their 14th NCAA playoff appearance en route to tying **Nolan's** career scoring record and Ithaca returned the next year, reaching the second round both years. Four more NCAA berths (including trips to the quarterfinal round that raised the program's total to a Division III-record 19) have come behind all-American **Chelsey Feldman**, who became the program's career scoring leader as a junior.

# Carp Wood Field

The women's soccer team has won nearly 80 percent of its home games since the program's inception in 1981. Ithaca's first home site was Allen Field before construction forced the team to play at Cass Park during the 1987 season. The Bombers then moved to their current home, Carp Wood Field.

Formerly known as Upper Terrace Field, the facility was renamed for Carlton "Carp" Wood, a 1939 Ithaca graduate and member of the school's Athletic Hall of Fame who coached three sports at his alma mater. Wood led Ithaca to the NCAA playoffs in baseball, men's basketball and men's soccer, becoming the first NCAA coach to accomplish that feat.

Recent renovations to the facility include construction of a press box as well as the addition of a section of stadium-style seating.

Ithaca won all eight of its home games in the program's first season, which remains the team's longest home winning streak. The Bombers set a Division III record by posting a 32-game home unbeaten streak from 1991-95, recording a mark of 29-0-3 over that span. Last fall Ithaca won a school-record 10 home games as part of the program's seventh unbeaten home record.

The Bombers have hosted a number of postseason events, starting with the 1986 Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Mid-Atlantic playoffs. Ithaca beat Alfred and Geneseo to win the program's first postseason title.

The Bombers' next chance to host a playoff tournament was the 1991 New York State Women's Collegiate Athletic Association (NYSWCAA) Championships. Two years later the state tournament returned to Upper Terrace Field and Ithaca claimed the program's third straight championship.

The 1992 season saw the first NCAA playoff competition at Upper Terrace Field, as Ithaca hosted a four-team regional. The NCAA regionals were held at Upper Terrace Field again in 1994, and two years later the Bombers posted their first NCAA playoff win at home, topping William Smith, 3-0.

The 1998 regionals were held at Ithaca and the Bomb-



ers won the regional title with wins over Cortland and William Smith. After beating Tufts in the national quarterfinals a week later, Ithaca was selected to host the NCAA semifinals and championship for the first time. A crowd of 1,000 fans watched Ithaca battle Macalester, College of New Jersey and Willamette for the national championship. Erin DeMarco and Jessica DiManno earned all-tournament honors for the Bombers.

In 2000 the Bombers hosted Scranton in a first-round NCAA playoff game and hosted Geneseo a year later in the ECAC playoffs. In 2003 and 2004 Ithaca topped Grove City and Misericordia in the opening round of the NCAA playoffs. Two years ago Ithaca hosted a regional tournament for the first time since 1998. The regionals returned to Carp Wood Field last fall.

In 2002 the Bombers hosted the inaugural Empire 8 championship tournament after winning the league's regular-season title; Ithaca hosted that event again in 2004 and hosted semifinal contests in 2003 and 2006 and both rounds the past two seasons. Ithaca has a home postseason record of 24-5-4 (.788), including a 7-3-2 mark in NCAA playoff competition.

Carp Wood Field is also home to the men's soccer and women's lacrosse teams, and has hosted NCAA playoff games and Empire 8 championship tournaments in both sports.

Hired in 1994 as the program's fourth head coach, Quigg has become the program's winningest coach. Last fall she led the Bombers to the postseason for the 14th time in her career and to the NCAA quarterfinals for the fourth time. She was named Empire 8 Coach of the Year. Ithaca has earned 10 NCAA playoff berths during her career, including 1998's trip to the national semifinals. Quigg was the Ithaca Journal's selection as female coach of the year that year. She was also honored as the Empire Athletic Association (EAA) co-coach of the year in 1994 and as the NSCAA regional coach of the year in 1996. In 2004 she shared the NYSWCAA's Coach of the Year award and was named Empire 8 Coach of the Year.

Quigg came to Ithaca after three years as the women's soccer coach at West Virginia Wesleyan. She directed the Bobcats to a 38-18 record and two district runner-up finishes.

Quigg earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from William Smith in 1989 and her master's in business administration from West Virginia Wesleyan in 1992. She was a captain and goalkeeper for William Smith's 1988 national champion team. Quigg set a school record with 325 saves, and the Herons were 56-10-6 during her college career.

In addition to her soccer duties at Ithaca, Quigg is an instructor in the School of Health Sciences and Human Performance.

An assistant women's soccer coach since 1987, Long has helped the Bomber program to a 236-67-52 record and two national championships during his tenure. Long is also the men's lacrosse coach at Ithaca and will be inducted into the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame this fall.

Long works primarily with the goalkeepers. He has worked with Beth Howland '92, the 1991 Intercollegiate Soccer Athletic Association (ISAA) goalkeeper of the year and a 1998 inductee into the Ithaca College Athletic Hall of Fame; and Emily Johnson '95, who earned NSCAA second-team all-American honors in 1993.

Long's 22-year lacrosse coaching record is 212-102 with 12 postseason berths, including five NCAA appearances. Long has been named Empire 8 coach of the year five times and was named the USILA Coach of the Year in 1992.

A former all-conference player at Division I Tennessee Tech, McAlarnen is in her second season with the Bomber staff. As a player, she served as team captain as a senior and was named her team's defensive MVP twice. A Dean's List student and NSCAA all-academic selection, she earned her bachelor's degree in secondary education (with a history minor).

## BOMBER COACHING RECORDS
